Is mór an pléisiúr dom fáilte a chur romhaibh go léir chuig Gradaim na nDea-Chúiseanna an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta, oíche atá tiomnaithe do cheiliúradh a dhéanamh ar an dtionchar suntasach ar fud na hÉireann a d'fhéadfaí a bhaint amach le tacaíocht ón gCrannchur Náisiúnta.

Tá na héachtaí a cheiliúraimid anseo aontaithe ag téama cumhachtach amháin: tiomantas seasmhach d'áit níos fearr a dhéanamh as Éire. Is mór an pléisiúr dom a bheith páirteach i gceiliúradh na ngradam an tráthnóna seo, áit a dtugaimid onóir do mhórchuid oibre luachmhar na 35 Iomaitheoir Náisiúnta. Is mór an onóir dom a bheith mar chuid den searmanas seo agus aitheantas a thabhairt do na héachtaí suntasacha atá déanta agaibh.

In 2024 amháin, tiomsaíodh €239.3 milliún do Dhea-Chúiseanna áitiúla i bpobail ar fud na hÉireann, ag tacú le breis agus 4,500 grúpa pobail agus deonach ar fud na tíre.

Níl sa saothar dochreidte a léiríodh anocht ach cuid bheag de na tionscadail ríthábhachtacha a mhaoinítear thar earnálacha amhail oidhreacht, Gaeilge, an óige, forbairt tuaithe agus pobail, na healaíona agus cultúr, sláinte agus spórt.

Ó thionscadail na n-ealaíon a spreagann cruthaitheacht agus muinín, go tionscnaimh óige a thugann guth do dhaoine óga nó grúpaí spóirt agus pobail a thugann pobail le chéile, léiríonn Iomaitheoirí Náisiúnta na bliana seo an tionchar cumhachtach atá ag maoiniú na nDea-Chúiseanna ar fud na tíre. Léiríonn na heagraíochtaí seo an chaoi a gcuidíonn tionscadail áitiúla le hÉire níos beoga, níos cuimsithí agus níos nasctha a mhúnlú do chách. Táim bródúil go bhfuil mo Roinn ag obair i gcomhpháirtíocht leis an gCrannchur Náisiúnta chun na hiarrachtaí seo a chur chun cinn.

Anuraidh, d'fháiltigh mé roimh fhoilsiú Thuarascáil Bhliantúil 2023 na nDea-Chúiseanna an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta, an chéad tuarascáil dá leithéid a chuir mo Roinn le chéile chun trédhearcacht a fheabhsú maidir le leithdháileadh mhaoiniú an Chrannchuir Náisiúnta. Leagann an tuarascáil béim ar an ról ríthábhachtach atá ag an maoiniú seo chun tacú le pobail ar fud na hÉireann. Táim ag tnúth le foilsiú leanúnach na tuarascála tábhachtach seo, agus eagrán 2024 le bheith foilsithe níos déanaí i mbliana.

Ar deireadh, ba mhaith liom mo bhuíochas o chroí a chur in iúl do bhur dtiomantas. Aithníonn an Rialtas bhur seirbhís gan staonadh do chlubanna, do bhailte agus do phobail, agus molaim daoibh leanúint ar aghaidh le bhur gcuid oibre fíorluachmhar chun feabhas a chur ar shaolta ar fud na tíre.
